Vicroads informed me that the permit had been cancelled and I would have to start from scratch with a new roadworthey etc (nearly \$400).

I went home to have a bit of a think about it and called Vicroads head office and was told the permit had been cancelled because no payment had been made the previous year and no renewal was sent out. I informed Vicroads that I had a receipt from the previous year and they should check their records, which they did and then managed to find that it had been paid. Vicroads then changed the status of my permit from cancelled to expired and

said I could now pay the fee to make it current. I went into the local office to pay and they said it was still cancelled, but a call to their head office fixed it and I paid up.
